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

PLEASE PREPARE YOURSELF TO FACE THE INTERVIEW

• Update your resume very frequently. Make sure your resume and cover letter are tailored to the specific teaching position you are applying for. Highlight your skills and experience that are relevant to the position.



• Practice your teaching skills. If you are invited to an interview, you will likely be asked to teach a sample lesson. Practice your teaching skills by teaching a lesson to a group of friends or family members.



• Write a mock lesson plan. Practice teaching this lesson plan. Do it watching yourself in a mirror if you do not find a group of people to practice.



• Check the School's website. You will get appropriate info about school. You can understand the culture of the school.

• Dress professionally. First impressions are important, so dress professionally for your interview. Choose clothes that are clean, pressed, and appropriate for the school setting.



• Be on time. Punctuality is important, so be sure to arrive on time for your interview. For this check the location physically, the day before. Take the interview call seriously.



• Be prepared to answer questions. The hiring manager will likely ask you questions about your teaching experience, your philosophy of education, and your classroom management skills. Be prepared to answer these questions in a clear and concise manner.



• Prepare information about the recent trends in Education. Make sure you read the glimpses of National Education Policy. Read National Curriculum Framework for school education booklet too. You will have a comprehensive idea about education in the present times.

• Ask questions. At the end of the interview, the HR or the Principal/ Management Committee will ask if you have any questions. This is your opportunity to learn more about the school and the teaching position. Be sure to ask thoughtful questions that show your interest in the position.



• Send a thank-you note. After your interview, send a thank-you note to the interviewer, irrespective of you being selected for the position. This is a polite way to express your appreciation for their time and to reiterate your interest in the position.

By following these tips, you can increase your chances of getting an interview for a teaching position.
